ART & HISTORY

March 11-Sept. 6

Fratino and Matisse: To See This Light Again

Annapolis-born and MICA-educated Louis Fratino extensively observed Matisse's works at the Baltimore Museum of Art. His study of the male figure as a central subject complements Matisse's portrayals of female models, highlighting the individuality of each artist's point of view. Drawn from the BMA's Cone Collection, loaned works and new paintings by Fratino, this exhibition captures the continuing influence of one of the most important artists of the 20th century. HER Maryland: Stories that Inspire. Maryland Women Icons Exhibition

Chesapeake Arts Center in Brooklyn Park presents the extraordinary

Boshell Lecture: iSalud! Beverages from Past to Present

Discover the historical origins, cultural practices and modern-day approaches to hot chocolate and tequila at the Walters Art Museum. Matisse in Vence:
The Stations of the Cross

A highlight of his late career, the Chapelle du Rosaire (Chapel of the Rosary), is Matisse's only large-scale architectural project. He designed every detail of the space, including a ceramic mural depicting the 14 stations of the cross. As the first thorough consideration of this mural, this exhibit at the BMA will include drawings that have never been displayed. Free. artbma.org

Douriean Fletcher:
Jewelry of the Afrofuture

Douriean Fletcher used jewelry as a powerful narrative tool in art, Black identity and visual storytelling. This exhibit at the Walters Art Museum features iconic futuristic jewelry and elaborate pieces Fletcher fashioned from natural materials, as well as brass and gold, that were inspired by ancestral traditions. Collection highlights include the jewelry she created for blockbuster films, "Black Panther," "Black Panther: Wakanda Forever" and "Coming 2 America," and the classic TV miniseries "Roots." Bus Tour: Baltimore's Patriots





